30 YEARS OF DIRT IN JAPAN

Interview: Nathan (aka Bene) Bennett is no stranger to the dirt of Minakami. #mtbjapan

ew Zealand-born Nathan Bennett, a long-term resident of Minakami, has raced in nearly every cycling discipline—except for gravel. That might change soon, as the avid bike racer gears up to help stage the wildest edition of Grinduro Japan yet, from October 18–20.

Bennett, the racer-turnedevent organiser, is the self-starting owner of MTB Japan and a prolific competitor in the Japanese bike world. A keen motocross rider as a youth, he took to downhill, dirt jumping, and cross-country mountain biking before moving to Japan in 1996 at the age of 24 where he started out as a

rafting guide. "After a few months, I was loving Minakami but less so the rafting work, so I thought I'd try MTB guiding. This quickly gained momentum, and I've now hosted more than 40,000 riders around these mountains," he explains, clearly wellversed in how to stage a good time for all abilities.

His early efforts caught the eye of Nobu Taguchi, a promi-

nent figure in Japanese cycling known for running successful bike shops and countless events including NODA Cycling Association Cup and always sold-out NCA Cup. "We ended up riding together for an article, and it was through him that I first got sponsored by Specialized." Bennett recalls how Taguchi gave him a comprehensive introduction to the Japanese cycling scene and brought him into the core of the country's off-road community—complete with more sponsorships, invitations to big competitions, free stuff, interviews, and more.

There is an infectious energy that Bennett exudes as we chat and it's hard not to be struck by his DIY ethics, which he's clearly picked up from years of extreme sports. You learn self-reliance by being out on the trails and backcountry. If something goes wrong, he's always had to fix it himself. That mindset is now being carried over into organising Grinduro Japan: "You can't wait for things to happen; you have to make

them happen." As the discussion continues, his character feels more fitting

to Southern California than the reserved culture of Japan, but if there's one thing that Bennett has succeeded at over the past 28 years, it's bringing along the locals as he shares the excitement for all things two wheels. It's this what makes him such a good fit for the global series, even if the responsibility scares





Established in 2009. "EQUIPT" is an original brand of Alternative Bicycles, a cool and mellow bicycle company.

After three and a half years of development, the ultimate compact and minimal tool "Sardine" has finally been com-

Below is a detailed explanation of this tool from Alternative

For many years, bicycle portable tools have remained the same shape and have not evolved. They

are box-shaped, difficult to turn, bulky, and heavy. This has been a headache for me for many years, but now I have finally arrived at this point.

This newly developed portable tool called "Sardine" is stickshaped, lightweight (only 38 grams!), and above all, easy

This shape allows you to turn it quickly and shorten the work time by straightening it. And if you turn it 90 degrees without replacing it, you can apply torque to loosen or tight-

The four tool bits move freely

so you can use them at any angle, and you can work in tight spaces such as when putting on and taking off a bottle cage

By turning 180 degrees when turning, you can work quickly and with torque.

We narrowed down the tool bits to five types: 6, 5, 4, 3 hex and T25 Torx. These are the ones we use most frequently during rides.

Also, it is easier to use chain cutters and smaller hexes if you have them separately.

We also made a dedicated holder. It can be attached under the bottle cage.

The holder has two holes in parallel, so please choose the one that suits the thickness of

Please note that if you carry it directly in your pocket, you may get injured in the event of a fall.


